EVERYTHING IS STRANGELY CONFUSED: WHAT HE HEARS AROUND HIM DURING THE PROCESS, WHAT HE REALLY EXPERIENCES AND WHAT HE THINKS.



ALL THESE MEMORIES WILL BE AN AWARENESS FOR JOEL. HE NO LONGER WANTS TO BE DEPRIVED OF THIS LOVE, AND THEN ENGAGES A RESISTANCE AGAINST "LACUNA". HE BASICALLY ONLY WANTS CLEMENTINE TO STILL LOVE HIM, EVEN IF IT MEANS THAT HE WILL HAVE TO REINVENT EVERYTHING SO THAT THEIR LOVE MAY REVIVE. THE THING IS THAT ANY PROCEDURE INITIATED MUST BE COMPLETED ...

From My personal point of view, this film is way more than a simple "love story". It requires the intervention from our inner part. It forces our mind to remember the thoughts it has put aside, pushed to the background. It asks the viewer to consider their own quieted memories, for better or for worse, and discover the role those events had in shaping who they are.
